## XV STRING FESTIVAL – STRINGFEST

25<sup>th</sup> – 28<sup>th</sup> May 2023 Sremska Mitrovica, Serbia

#### **ARTICLE 1.**

XV STRINGFEST will be held in Sremska Mitrovica from 25<sup>th</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> May 2023. It will be organised by Music school *Petar Krančević* from Sremska Mitrovica in cooperation with the *Krančević Art Asociation*. The competition is open to all musicians. The purpose of the competition is exchange of experiences between young musicians and their teachers, their promotion and encouragement in their further work and development.

#### **ARTICLE 2.**

The competition will be held in the following **DISCIPLINES** (full-time and part-time music school students, students who do not attend music schools, as well as students studying at colleges/universities, conservatories, or music academies):

- Violin
- Viola
- Cello
- Double bass
- Chamber music
- String orchestra

#### ARTICLE 3.

Competitors perform their programme from memory, except in the disciplines of chamber music and string orchestra.

<sup>Note:</sup> The entire competition program in solo disciplines is performed from memory with the exception of sonatas that are allowed to be played from sheets as part of a own choice composition. Repetitions can be performed if it does not exceed the stipulated minutes.

#### **ARTICLE 4.**

The organiser is not under obligation to provide a piano accompanist, but, if necessary, will provide a contact for one. You may inquire with the organiser about the fee – covering a rehearsal, a general rehearsal and the performance. All candidates who decide on engaging an official accompanist have to state the fact in their application, and send a copy of the sheet music, at the latest 20 days before the start of the competition to e-mail: stringfest.sm@gmail.com

## STRING ORCHESTRA

Number of members in a string orchestra is not limited.

I category – Elementary school	Free choice of programme lasting up to 15 minutes
II category – Secondary school	Free choice of programme lasting up to 25 minutes

**Note**: Competitors belonging to a younger category according to their year of birth can compete in older categories, too.

#### ARTICLE 6.

Competitors cannot change the programme they entered the competition with. Competitors will perform their programmes in accordance with the rules. Competitors choose the order of compositions to perform.

#### ARTICLE 7.

The timetable and the order of candidates' performances in all categories will be publish on the competition website 7 days before the start of the competition, at the latest. The candidates will inform themselves about the timetable and the order of the competition. The competitors will check in with the secretary of the competition upon arrival and present an appropriate identification document two hours before the competition in their category, at the latest.

#### ARTICLE 8.

An unlimited number of prizes is awarded in each category, according to the number of points won:

I prize: from 95 to 100 points
II prize: from 85 to 94,99 points
III prize: from 75 to 84,99 points

• Commendation: from 70 to 74,99 points.

#### ARTICLE 9.

The jury may award **LAUREATE** prizes. The chosen laureates are, if invited by the organiser, under obligation to play at the closing concert of the STRINGFEST.

- a) Violin categories I to III
- b) Violin categories IV and V
- c) Violin categories VI and VII
- d) Viola all categories
- e) Cello all categories
- f) Double bass all categories
- g) Chamber music all categories
- h) Orchestra.

#### Article 10.

Other than laureate prizes, the jury will also award the following honours:

- *Derđ Zazrović* award for the most promising teacher,
- The Festival's pre-eminent piano accompanist award,
- Sremska Mitrovica Rotary club awards a financial prize to the absolute soloist winner of the string festival.

#### ARTICLE 11.

The jury members will be selected from the ranks of recognised music teachers and performers form Serbia and abroad. The jury decisions are final and irrevocable.

#### ARTICLE 12.

The competitors pay for their own travel and accommodation expenses in Sremska Mitrovica.

#### ARTICLE 13.

In cases of cancelation, the candidates' donation and documents will not be returned.

#### **ARTICLE 14.**

The organiser reserves the right to record reproduce and broadcast the programme.

#### ARTICLE 15.

To apply, the following is required:

- Birth certificate, or a photocopy of the passport,
